## How to Become a Member

To become a member of the Durham Woman's Club, you must fill out an application and attend 2 General Meetings. This way you see the club in action. If you just want to have lunch once a month, this is not the club for you. The Membership Committee brings each applicant before the Executive Board for approval.

Each new member has a Sponsor which is a club woman who vouches for your integrity and helps you become involved in the club. Dues are \$60 per year, due in April. About \$40 per member goes to the State and District organizations and funds.
